Dutch Influence on The Fur Trade

- De Bellois (1570 to 1608)
- From 1613 to 1620 - Company of Montmorency) (Incl. Du Gua, Francois Grave du Pont and Champlain)
- Protestant Merchants

NOTE: The fur trade was linked by merchant families who had an ancestry in the mercantile trade, had religious affiliations, or had intermarried with them.
