NOTE: In 1614, because of his royal commission to build colonies, **he formed two trading companies:** the 'Compagnie des Marchands de Rouen et de Saint-Malo' and 'Compagnie de Champlain'. Merchants signed a trade contract with him for eleven years. (1614-1625)

Note: In 1615, he returned to New France with 4 members of the Recollets Order

- Changes Implemented by France

NOTE: Champlain was de facto, the Governor of New France, even though he could not officially hold the title. Lands and title went only to those of noble birth.



When Champlain died in 1635, there were 150 inhabitants in Quebec.

Champlain served under various Viceroys and Lieutenants.

Year	Position	Under
1608 - 1612	Lieutenant	Lieutenant-General Pierre Du Gua De Monts
1612	Lieutenant	Lieutenant General Bourbon de Soissons
1612-20	Lieutenant	Viceroy Bourbon de Condé
1620-25	Lieutenant	Viceroy de Montmorency
1625-1627	Lieutenant	Viceroy de Ventadour
1627-1628	Commander	de Ventadour resigned. The Compagnie des Cent-Associés - Cardinal de Richelieu
1629- 1635	Commander	The Compagnie des Cent-Associés - Cardinal de Richelieu
